Dr. Jack Fabian was well-known in Pensacola as a kind, sensitive, and beloved physician.

At ECW we also knew him as a longtime member, a member of the ECW Board of Directors, and a prolific and talented writer. He participated in the Tuesday evening critique group for several years.

Along with a variety of writing, we especially anticipated the antics of his characters, tiny toy poodles that he personified in the novel he was writing.

He shared our work with his wife Mary each week, and she often offered comments and encouragement to group members as well. Along with Jack Beverly, he read weekly to the residents at Carpenters Creek Assisted Living.
